As a class, or in groups write down some words and emotions that describe Miranda at the start of the book

At he opposite end of the paper/board write down words or describe her at the end of the book.

Look at what happened to her during the story and the people she met during the summer, and talk about how they helped those changes come about.



Book Covers The Arts—Visual Arts

Ask the class who has heard of the saying 'Don't Judge a Book By It's Cover'

Then ask who does, judge books by their covers.

The Secret Summer was published in the USA with a different title and a different cover.

Use the images on this page or find the images online to show the two for comparison. Ask students which one they prefer.

Spend some time in the library looking at novels, and make choices juts based on their covers.

Either as a class or in small groups talk about the choices, and what made those cover images so appealing.

Are there common elements that make a good cover Or is it a purely personal

Now find a book that has a cover you find unappealing. What is it about this cover that makes the book unappealing to you.

Ask the students to choose a book, either a favourite, or one of the books where they didn't like the cover, and ask them to design a new one. They can use any media, drawing, painting, collage or use a publishing program.


