Sunny isn't quite sure if Christmas in the desert with his meerkat family is the right sort of Christmas – there's no snow, no fir trees and no figgy pudding!

So he heads off on a journey round the world looking for the picture perfect Christmas . . . before realizing he might have left it at home after all.

From the twice winner of the CILIP Kate Greenaway Medal and the creator of Tidy, Cyril and Pat and Again!, Meerkat Christmas is a witty and heartwarming celebration of festive fun and family love that shows Christmas can be whatever you want it to be.

Author Bio

Emily Gravett was born in Brighton, England, the second daughter of a printmaker and an art teacher. She left school at 16 and travelled the UK for eight years, living in a big green bus with her partner and their daughter. After returning to Brighton to take up an art degree, Emily sprang into the limelight with the ground-breaking Wolves in 2005, which won her the Macmillan Prize for Illustration, followed by a book deal and the first of her Kate Greenaway Medals. Wolves was followed by such brilliant modern classics as Orange Pear Apple Bear,

Little Mouse's Big Book of Fears, Again! and the exquisite Tidy.



Each book is unique and different from the last – and each features endearing, beautifully drawn characters that touch the heart and tickle the funny bone. Emily now lives in Brighton with her family. When not working in her studio, she might be found walking the dog, watering the tomatoes or driving the family's restored 1960s bus.

Pre Reading

Show the cover of Meerkat Christmas to your students, reading the name of the book out loud, and ask the following:

There is a word crossed out on the front cover. What word was crossed out and what word replaces it?

There is a tag on the front cover that has a name on it. That is the name of the author, Emily Gravett. Some books have two names on the fornt, one for the author, and one for the illustrator. Wjat does it mean of there's only on n

Now turn the cover over and show the back of the book to your students, reading out loud what the book will be about.

- Read through without stopping and then go back and look at each page more closely.
- Read the main text as well as the cards.
- You might want to stop when Santa is in his sleigh. Have a close look at the presents in the back.
- Is there something unusual about one of the presents? Can you read the tag on that present?

A Closer Look (Visual Literacy)

Sunny visits a lot of different places looking for the perfect Christmas. Now let's look at each double page more closely and see if we can figure out where he has visited. Have a map of the world, to show where Sunny has visited.

Sunny's first stop: Kev's

- What is the weather like?
- What season do yo think it is?
- What country do you think he's in?
- What can you see on the page that helps you guess?

Trevor's

- This one is more tricky.
- Does anyone know where this animal comes from?
- There is another big clue at the end of the Christmas card.
- In the card, Sunny mentions that Trev is a Tarsier (Tarsier, (family Tarsiidae), any of six or more species of small leaping primates found only on various islands of Southeast Asia, including the Philippines)

Robin's

- Raining, but no snow.
- The bird is a robin red breast The European robin (Erithacus rubecula), It is found across Europe, east to Western Siberia and south to North Africa; it is sedentary in most of its range except the far north.
- No clues as to which exact country Sunny is in.
- Look at the map and locate Europe.

Penguin

- Very Cold.
- Snow.
- No Trees
- There are two different possibilities as to where Sunny might be.
- The North Pole or The South Pole.
- Only one of these places has penguins. Do you know where Sunny is?

Reindeer

- Cold
- SnowTrees

Discussion Questions

A Closer Look (Visual Literacy)

Weather Around the World

Sunny visits lots of countries to try and find the perfect Christmas.

- Find the Kalahari on a globe.
- Find out what the weather would be like there at Christmas time (December)
- Find all of the different countries on the globe.
- Talk about why it can be hot in some countries and snowing in others depending

where they are on the globe.

What is the weather like where you are?

- What Season is it?
- Is it always hot and sunny at Christmas time in Australia?
- Find out about the different weather in different parts of Australia.
- Find out about the six Aboriginal seasons and their characteristics.
