- identifying the narrative voice (the person or entity through whom the audience experiences the story) in a literary work, discussing the impact of first person narration on empathy and engagement
- examining texts written from different narrative points of view and discussing what information the audience can access, how this impacts on the audience's sympathies, and why an author might choose a particular narrative point of view

- How does this affect the story?
- How would it have been different if only one twin told the story?

Discuss:

- How do you think you would feel if an identical twin pretended to be you for a day/week or longer?
- How would you feel if YOU could be someone else for a day/week/ or longer?
- Would you try and fool everyone into thinking you WERE the other person Or would you do lots of things that the other person would never do?
- Some of Steph's friends feel angry when they figured out Anna and Steph had switched. How would you feel if you had been fooled in the same way?

Write:

Create literary texts that experiment with structures, ideas and stylistic features of selected author .

Choose any scene from the book, and write it from another characters point of view, not including Anna or Steph.

It could be the Mum or Dad, or one of their friends.
