We learn a lot about the characters on the first few chapters.

List the characters and what we know about them:

- · Luna 10 years old, loves donkeys, wants to make things better
- · Margot likes all things mechanical, oldest
- · Fabien loves to knit, generous, youngest
- Dad unemployed, sad
- · Mum hardworking, optimist

How easy is it to get a 'picture' of someone using only a few words?

Have each student list between 5- 10 things about themselves. Then read them out to the class and see if students can guess who is being described. Example:

- I have brown hair
- I have two brothers
- I walk to school
- My favourite subject is science
- · I love watching footy

- · I play netball
- I am allergic to peanuts
- My favourite book is Charlotte's Web
- I play the guitar
- · I am scared of spiders

Of the three siblings, discuss which one you most identify with?

- Luna is not sure about the move, but doesn't think they have any other choice, If they don't move they will be homeless
- Margot does not want to leave London, her school, her friends. Loves living in the city
- · Fabien is excited about the move, and all of the possibilities the island will offer him

How do you think you would feel if your family had won an island and had to move?

- · What part of winning an island would be exciting?
- · What things might make you feel sad/nervous/anxious?
- How would your relationship with family members be affected, in the case of some family members wanting to make the move, and others not wanting to?

Competition Entry

The book is called We Won An Island, because Luna entered a competition she saw in the paper.

All she had to do was write a letter/email stating why she wanted to win.

Imagine you can enter the same competition.

- · Write a letter giving all of the reasons you want, and deserve to win your very own island.
- In the book, the winner had to show how they would bring joy to the island again.
- Think about what you would do on the island to make it a joyful place to live.
- These letters be read out in class and voted on.

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Rook Island

Draw a map of Rook island, based on the information we are given in the book.

Discuss as a class the features we know about.

These features must be included on the map.

Look at different maps to see how particular features may be illustrated, such as tees/hills/beaches etc. Tourist maps may be the best choice for this, like the one below:



These are the things we know about the island

- When they arrive at the island, they land on a golden beach, there is a wall of pine trees in front of them.
- They go up a hill, through the trees.
- They arrive in a field, they see their house is in the distance.
- Their house is in the middle of the island
- There's clifftops, and a path that leads to another, smaller, beach (different from the one they arrived at) on the northern side of the island,
- There's a stable block.

As long as these known features are included on the map, students can add their own features as they see fit.

Perhaps they can include the things they would do to the island if they won it.
