1. Matty Forever (Elizabeth Fensham)

\$14.95 \$11.95

Mat and Bill are neighbours - and best friends. They've told each other their deepest, darkest secrets and in return provide each other with someone to trust and to turn to when things aren't right at home. For Bill, it's a challenging time of missing his father, consoling his sad mother, and starting a new school. For Matty, it is the strength of Bill's steady friendship when her family is different from the rest. When you have a friendship like Bill and Matty do, nothing else matters.

2. Darius Bell and the Glitter Pool (Odo Hirsch) The Bell family's ancestors were showered with honours, gifts and grants of land. In exchange, they've bestowed a Gift, once every 25 years, on the town. The Gifts have ranged from a statue to a bell tower, but now it's Darius's father's turn, and there is no money for an impressive gift. Will Darius's glittering discovery be enough to save his family?

3. Running With Horses (Alison Lester)

\$29.95 \$23.95

This picture book celebrates the turbulent history of the famous Spanish Riding School. Nina and her father live in a beautiful riding school famous for their rare performing horses. Nina loves the horses that her father looks after, but she also loves one of the old carriage horses outside the school. It's a perfect world for a little girl, although she has to compete with her father's work for his attention. But a war is coming that will threaten their lives and the very existence of the school.

4. Whisperer, The (Fiona Mcintosh)

Griff is an ordinary boy, working at a circus - but he has an extraordinary ability. He can receive peoples' thoughts, although in an unfocussed way. When the circus master decides to exploit this talent, disaster ensues. Griff decides to escape, taking fellow circus member Tess and her magical creatures with him.

5. Pearl Verses the World (Sally Murphy and Heather Potter)

\$14.95 \$11.95 Pearl's teacher wants her to write poems that rhyme but Pearl's poems don't. At home, however, Pearl feels safe and loved, but her grandmother is slowly fading. When her grandmother eventually passes away, Pearl wants life to go back to the way it was and refuses to talk at the funeral. But she finds the courage to deliver a poem for her grandmother that defies her teacher's idea of poetry - her poem doesn't rhyme; it comes from the heart.

6. Tensy Farlow and the Home for Mislaid Children (Jen Storer) \$19.95 \$15.95

Tensy Farlow was abandoned as a baby, rescued from near drowning in the River Charon and pursued by the evil mud-woman, Lythia. Finding herself in the Homerofor Mislaid Children, Tensy earns the admiration of all the orphans and forms a trio with the plucky Howard and forlorn little Polly. When Polly's sister disappears, and two angels start spying on the orphanage, it becomes clear that everyone is after Tensy and they'll stop at nothing to get her.

25. Stolen (Lucy Christopher)

Told in a moving letter to her captor, sixteen-year-old Gemma relives her kidnapping from Bangkok airport while on holiday. Taken by Ty, her troubled young stalker, to the wild and desolate Australian outback she reflects on a landscape from which there's no escape.

26. Winds of Heaven, The (Judith Clarke)

\$22.99 \$18.39

When Fan was little she dreamed of magical countries in the far away blue hills. And as she grew up she dreamed of love, and the boys came after her one by one by one. Clementine thought her cousin Fan's house in the country had a special smell: of sun and dust and kerosene and the wild honey they are for breakfast on their toast. But then there were the feelings: the anger that smelled like iron and the disappointment that smelled like mud.

27. Liar (Justine Larbalestier)

Micah Wilkins is a liar. But when her boyfriend Zach, dies under brutal circumstances, the shock might be enough to set her straight. Or maybe not. Was Micah dating Zach? Did they kiss? Did she see him the night he died? Where does the truth actually lie?

As he falls in love with Electra, Marc grapples with a world so much less simple than the world of school that he is used to.

29. Small Free Kiss In the Dark, A (Glenda Millard)

Skip's an outsider, a quiet observer. He draws pictures to make sense of the world. He's never fitted in. So he takes to the streets. Life there may be hard, but it's better than the one he's left, especially when he teams up with old Billy. Then come the bombs which leave little Max in his care, and also Tia, the sad dancer, with her sweet baby, Sixpence. Scavenging for food, living on love and imagination...how long can Skip's fragile new family hold out as war grips the city?

30. Loving Richard Feynman (Penny Tangey)

Richard Feynman was a Nobel Prize-winning physicist. Catherine is a science-loving fifteen-year-old. Richard helped build the atom bomb. Catherine is just trying to survive school. NOTABLE BOOKS: YOUNGER READERS (31-49)

Intended for independent younger readers

(RRP) (SCHOOL)

31. Remarkable Secret of Aurelie Bonhoffen, The (Deborah Abela)

\$15.95 \$14.36

Ever since Aurelie Bonhoffen was a child, she has juggled, played the dead girl on the ghost train and the back end of the cow in the marquee of Bonhoffen's Seaside Pier. On her twelfth birthday, she stumbles on her family's remarkable secret.

32. Dinosaur Knights (Michael Gerard Bauer)

\$18.99 \$17.10

Dinosaur Knights is a gripping fantasy adventure about a scientist who attempts to bring a dinosaur through time. When the dinosaur becomes stranded in the Middle Ages, it crosses the path of two young boys and changes their lives forever. Roland dreams of being a knight while Oswald imagines a future as a physician; neither boy expected to face a dragon.

33. Zoo of Magical and Mythological Creatures, The (Sam Bowring) \$14.99 \$13.50 Twelve-year-old Zackary is a most reluctant knight. He would rather put anchovies in the knights helmets or use his sword to cut sandwiches than learn courtly ways. In despair, the King and Queen assign him to the castle administrator, Barnabas, who sends him to the Zoo of Magical and Mythological Creatures, established by Zackary's grandfather.

34. Cicada Summer (Kate Constable)

\$15.99 \$14.40

When Eloise's Dad moves them back to his home town to turn the derelict family mansion into a convention centre, Eloise feels an immediate bond with the old house. She begins spending all her time there. Eloise meets a 'ghost girl' who may or may not be from the house's past, and events take a strange - and ultimately dangerous – turn.

35. Victor's Challenge (Pamela Freeman and Kim Gamble)

\$12.95 \$11.66

Prince Victor and Valerian want to get married. But Victor, in his own unusual way, must pass three seemingly impossible tests of bravery, endurance and cleverness.

36. Donkey Who Carried the Wounded, The (Jackie French) \$14.99 \$13.50

Based on the famous story of Simpson and his Donkey - this book examines the remarkable life of the man and the donkey who become a legend at Gallipoli, even among the Turkish forces.

37. Samurai Kids: Shaolin Tiger (Sandy Fussell and Rhian Nest James) \$14.95 \$13.46 Long before Sensei Ki-Yaga built the Cockroach Ryu, he travelled to China and studied at the Shalin Temple in the north-western Song Shan Mountains of China. Sensei promised to return to help the abbot in the Temple's time of need. The Samurai Kids journey to China to fulfil a promise Sensei Ki-Yaga made many years ago.

38. Museum of Mary Child, The (Cassandra Golds)

\$17.95 \$16.16

Heloise lives with her godmother in an isolated cottage. Next door is a museum dedicated to the memory of Mary Child. Visitors enter it with a smile and depart with fear in their eyes. One day, Heloise finds a doll under the floorboards. Against her godmother's wishes, she keeps it. And that's when the truce between Heloise and her godmother begins to unravel.

39. Chook Called Harry, A (Phillip Gwynne and Terry Denton)

\$12.95 \$11.66

There are ten chooks in the beautiful new chook-house, but Chris's favourite, Happy Harry, isn't pulling her weight. Can Chris save Harry when his dad wants to get rid of her?

40. Audrey's Big Secret (Christine Harris and Ann James)

\$14.99 \$13.50

Audrey Barlow has woken up in the dead of night and needs to go to the dunny. The only problem is, the dunny is outside. And if that isn't bad enough, Audrey sees what she thinks is a ghost! But Audrey soon discovers that it wasn't a ghost she spotted at all, but a young girl who's run away. Together they must think of a way to keep Janet safe.

41. Star Jumps (Lorraine Marwood)

A verse novel told through the eyes of Ruby, day-to-day farm life involves playing in grassy paddocks with siblings, doing jobs and helping out, and witnessing birth, death and sacrifice. The family are devastated when they have to sell off some of their herd, but in the spirit of hope it is Ruby who tries in her own small way to help the family.

42. Mbobo Tree (Glenda Millard and Anne White)

\$27.99 \$25.20

The magical and mysterious story of a little girl, found under a tree as a baby, who saves her village - and the villagers' lifegiving tree - through her bravery.

43. Book from Baden Dark, The (James Moloney)

On a mountainside in Elster, Bea, who has lived among the elves all this time, longs to see her human friends again. When strange creatures disturb the peace of the mountain forests and her grandfather disappears, she calls for Marcel's help. Together with his cousin, Fergus, they travel into the underground world of Baden Dark on a rescue mission.

44. Don't Breathe a Word (Margaret Musgrove)

I have sworn never to say anything about what happened that night. I've tried my best to keep that promise. It's hard, though. I'm sure Mrs B. suspects something, and Mahesh must think I'm weird for avoiding him. My best friend Annie is too busy hanging out with Regan and Tegan to notice. But someone will find out if we're not super careful.

45. Just One Wish (Sally Rippin)

Penny has just moved to Australia from China. She can hardly speak English. She doesn't know anyone. And horrible Cousin Betty is determined to make life at her new school totally miserable. But then her grandmother gives her a magic Chinese pouch. Penny has just one wish to make things right.

46. Battle for Rondo, The (Emily Rodda)

\$34.99 \$31.50

Peril awaits Leo and Mimi on their return to the fantastic world of Rondo. With the help of Rondo's seven best witches and wizards, their friends have made plans to combat the attacks of the Blue Queen. The queen has a dragon on her side, and is plotting a terrible revenge on all those who have defied her.

47. Captain Congo and the Maharaja's Monkey (Ruth Starke and Greg Holfeld) \$24.95 \$22.46 When the Maharaja of Bekar dies suddenly and mysteriously, Captain Congo and Pug are despatched by the Agency to investigate. They arrive in India to find the Palace of Rajputana teeming with intrigue. Even as preparations begin for young Prince Beki to be anointed as the next maharaja, it is clear that powerful enemies are scheming against him.
