AUSTRALIAN PICTURE BOOKS (11-44)

(RRP) (SCHOOL)

11. Adventures of Edgar Remington the Third (John Moreton and Terry Denton)In his eagerness to find a new home on the other side of the world Edgar Remington the Third has set sail without a map or a compass. Now he's lost. This is a delightful, comic tale of a small white rabbit with a big dream, and his adventures on the high seas. This first time author brings us a thoroughly refreshing and engaging picture book.

12. Alphabet Wings (Ilana M Kresner)

Alphabet Wings is a flying world journey through 26 cities, beginning with A for Amsterdam and ending with Z for Zurich. Each city visit explores festivals, foods, legends, sounds, smells and architecture and comes from a different country together representing all the major continents. The layered hand-cut paper illustrations give a three-dimensional effect and bright colours capture the moods of the cities.

13. And Kangaroo Played his Didgeridoo (Nigel Gray and Glen Singleton)

You should have come To this great Aussie do. The guest list sure read Like an Aussie who's who But best part of all, And I tell you it's true, Was that kangaroo played His didgeridoo Join all your favourite Aussie animals, including Koala, Wombat and Gecko, as they party all night long!

14. Angel Breath (Glenda Millard and Dee Huxley)

\$27.05 \$25.16

This picture book transports the reader to a lush European forest. One autumn afternoon a French farmer Pierre and his pig Jean-Jacques are searching for truffles in the forest, hoping to change their bad luck when they come upon something that turns their fortune right around. The resonant words and wondrous illustrations evoke the breath of an angel in this stunning, lyrical picture book.

15. Becoming Buddha The Story of Siddharth (Whitney Stewart and Sally Rippin) \$27.95 \$25.16 Born a wealthy prince in what is now Nepal in about 563 BC Siddarth gradually gave up worldly ways until, at age thirty-five, he attained supreme enlightenment and became the Buddha. With a foreword by the Dalai Lama, the story is beautifully illustrated with rich oriental style paintings. An author's note at the end gives background information and is followed by suggestions on how to meditate, by the Dalai Lama.

16. Breakfast with Buddha (Vashti Farrer and Gaye Chapman)

When Sati finds herself homeless after a flood, she goes to a monastery to beg for food. But she is accustomed to being top cat, and here she is just one of many. She tries to have her own way, but this makes trouble for the others and creates havoc in the courtyard. In the end, it is only the patience of the old monk that wears down Sati's pride.

17. Circus Carnivore (Mark Svendsen and Ben Redlich)

Welcome, quite literally, inside the mind of a noisy, tantrumming child. Inside her head is the Noise-A-Matron, the nonsense machine that makes all her wallingly naughty noises. We also meet the workers who make sure the machine is always going full blast! to delight in the deliriously explosive illustrations and the sheer joy of wickedly wild nonsense verse wordplay.

18. Dancing the Book-Cha-Cha-Boogie (Narelle Oliver)

One afternoon, many tides ago, three little murmels were playing at the water's edge. An old arkel had washed ashore. The air was warm. Before long they flopped down in their new hide out and fell deep into murmel-snooze. Then it came. A deep, deep rumble ... As the three little murmels play in a leaky old arkel, a wild whirligig destroys their homeland and sets the arkel drifting towards an alien shore. While the shipwrecked murmels sleep, they are thrown into prison. They awake to hear the ruler of the land, the Boss Snig, telling them that as soon as their boat has been fixed, they must leave. There is little hope for homeless murmels until they are befriended by a young snig. Soon, the four friends begin to share each other's lives and customs: their food, their games and their dancing.

19. Dogs Do, Dogs Don't (Frank Moffatt)

Our dogs are very well trained. But are they, really? Frank's dogs are pretty naughty. But they have a different opinion . . . they think they're perfect. What do you think?

20. Emily The Dragon (Lyn Lee and David Cornish)

Emily and Egg love to dance, but Emily's brother Jock is scornful of such girly behaviour. He's a knight, and he can roam the country looking for dragons to fight! Emily sets out into the Dark Old Forest to prove that she can fight dragons too. In this gentle, witty story, gender stereotypes are overturned as Emily meets a knight who loves to knit and a dragon who wears a tutu and ballet shoes.

21. Father Koala's Fairytales (Kel Richards and Glen Singleton)

31. Old Tom Man of Mystery (Leigh Hobbs)

Angela Throgmorton decides one day that Old Tom is old enough to help around the house, but Old Tom has different ideas. Suddenly he feels sick and Angela feels sorry for him. Can Old Tom avoid helping around the house or will Angela catch him out?

32. Olga the Brolga (Rod Clement)

Olga the Brolga is in a terrible mood. She desperately wants to dance, but no one will dance with her. Her parents have other things to do, Ellie the crocodile doesn't feel like jumping around, and Joanna Jacana only wants to sleep. As for Lilly the long-neck, well, she's a bit grumpy, too!

33. One-0-Saur, Two-O-Saur (David Bedford and Leonie Worthington)

36. Seadragon Sea (Margaret Spurling and Danny Snell)

The sea is a dangerous place, especially for a baby seadragon left far behind and all alone. Will he ever catch up with his brothers and sisters, or find the beautiful seagrass meadow that is his home? This picture book is by the same team that created Bilby Moon and features the Australian flora and fauna of the coastal temperate waters of the Southern Ocean. Stunning illustrations are complemented by a text, which includes a counting element.

37. Shack That Dad Built, The (Elaine Russell)

When Elaine Russell was five, her dad built the family a shack just outside the Aboriginal mission at La Perouse in Sydney. In The Shack that Dad Built, Elaine illustrates what life was like for an indigenous kid on the urban fringes. Her colourful, painterly illustrations vividly recreate these childhood experiences.

38. Short and Incredibly Happy Life of Riley, The (Colin Thompson and Amy Lissiat) Human beings live for quite a long time and for a lot of that time we are not happy. We want to be taller, shorter, fatter, thinner, older and younger. In short we are never satisfied. Rats live for quite a short time and for most of that time they are very, very happy... and we think we are better than rats!

39. Way I Love You, The (David Bedford and Ann James)

\$14.95 \$13.46

A charming, cheeky story about a little girl with a BIG personality, and her long-suffering, much-loved dog! David Bedford's affectionate story combined with Ann James's lively illustrations will delight children and adults alike.

40. What the Sky Knows (Nike Bourke and Stella Danalis)


