37. Amy and Louis (Libby Gleeson and Freya Blackwood)

Amy and Louis live next door to each other, and their lives are closely intertwined. But when Amy's family move to another country. the children are separated and the colour drains out of their lives - until Louis discovers how to rebuild their special bond. This is a loving, moving, goose-bumping tale of deep friendship.

38. Big Bad Bruce (Dianne Bates and Cheryll Johns)

Big Bad Bruce and his biker gang scream down the road on their Harleys and eat everything in sight at Moose McGreasy's diner. Then Bruce leaves - he has business to attend to. What could he possibly be up to next? A pushbike ride with his children! This is a warm, fast-paced biker story.

39. Dougal and Bumble and the Long Walk Home (Matt Dray)

When Dougal and Bumble get left behind at the Teddy Bears' Picnic they befriend a pig called Trevor. Trevor's lost as well and it's up to them to find their way back to their pretty pink house on the beach where all the other toys are waiting. But it's a long walk home... And the toys will have to brave injury, exhaustion and karaoke to get there!

40. Faust in Space (Matt Ottley)

Bad luck could be Faust's middle name. Faust's family decide to go on a holiday and leave poor Faust behind. Then, out of the blue, Faust's friends (the troublesome aliens) come to visit him and take him to their planet. Find out what sort of trouble Faust manages to get himself into in outer space!

41. Fiona the Pig's Big Day (Leigh Hobbs)

'I just know I'm going to miss her,' sniffed Mr Pig. 'Me too,' whispered Mrs Pig. Fiona the pig is leaving home. Afternoon tea with her dollies has been cancelled, and Mr and Mrs Pig haven't been able to sleep for days. Where is Fiona going? How will her parents cope without her? Find out in this second heartwarming story about Fiona and her adoring parents

42. Goat in a Boat, A (Belinda Nadin and Lloyd Foye)

The whale smiled to herself as she surged away, and blew with her blowhole spurting up spray . . . Three friends are stranded at sea, until they are rescued by a whale.

The people in Irving's apartment block seem to have lost the magic so Irving decides a magic show is just what they need. A moving, touching story of joy and friendship accompanied by beautiful evocative illustrations.

46. Josephine Wants to Dance (Jackie French and Bruce Whatley)

Josephine is a kangaroo - who loves to dance. Her little brother, Joey, tells her that kangaroos don't dance, they hop - but Josephine continues to point her toes and leap through the air. When a ballet troupe comes to town and both the lead ballerina and understudy are injured, Josephine's talents are called upon to help save the day.

47. Last Tree, The (Mark Wilson)

The Last Tree is the story of a beautiful old Eucalyptus tree that grew tall and strong over many years. The tree shelters and homes many different types of wildlife. As the centre of life in the forest, what will happen when the tree is threatened as the surrounding forest slowly disappears? What will become of those who live there?

48. Little Jingle Says No! (Kerrie O'Connor and Craig Smith)


58. Watchmaker Who Saved Christmas, The (Bruce Whatley)




